This is the final response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated 27 October 2007 for " - The letter of request; - The letter of response, - The contents of the administrative tracking file (notes, memos, email, letters, etc., etc.), and also - The first 200 pages of any records provided for each of the following eight (8) FOIA request cases at the NSA: 51864 51897 51978 51982 52003 52440 52467 52565." A copy of your request is enclosed. Your request has been processed under the FOIA and some of the documents you requested are enclosed. Certain information, however, has been deleted from the enclosures.

Some of the information deleted from the documents was found to be currently and properly classified in accordance with Executive Order 12958, as amended. This information meets the criteria for classification as set forth in Subparagraph (c) of Section 1.4 and remains classified TOP SECRET and SECRET as provided in Section 1.2 of the Executive Order. The information is classified because its disclosure could reasonably be expected to cause exceptionally grave or serious damage to the national security.

In addition, this Agency is authorized by various statutes to protect certain information concerning its activities. We have determined that such information exists in these documents. Accordingly, those portions are exempt from disclosure pursuant to the third exemption of the FOIA which provides for the withholding of information specifically protected from disclosure by statute. The specific statutes applicable in this case are Title 18 U.S. Code 798; Title 50 U.S. Code 403-1(i); and Section 6, Public Law 86-36 (50 U.S. Code 402 <u>note</u>).

Commercial and financial information that is privileged or otherwise confidential has also been deleted from the enclosures, pursuant to the fourth exemption of the FOIA.

Also, some of the information has been deleted from the enclosures pursuant to the fifth exemption of the FOIA. This exemption applies to interagency or intra-agency memoranda or letters which would not be available by law to a party in litigation with the agency, protecting information that is normally privileged in the civil discovery context, such as attorney-client privileged information.

Additionally, personal information regarding an individual has been deleted from the enclosures in accordance with 5 U.S.C. 552 (b)(6). This exemption protects from disclosure information that would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. In balancing the public interest for the information you request against the privacy interests involved, we have determined that the privacy interests sufficiently satisfy the requirements for the application of the (b)(6) exemption.

Since these deletions may be construed as a partial denial of your request, you are hereby advised of this Agency's appeal procedures. Any person denied access to information may file an appeal to the NSA/CSS Freedom of Information Act Appeal Authority. The appeal must be postmarked no later than 60 calendar days from the date of the initial denial letter. The appeal shall be in writing addressed to the NSA/CSS FOIA Appeal Authority (DJP4), National Security Agency, 9800 Savage Road STE 6248, Fort George G. Meade, MD 20755-6248. The appeal shall reference the initial denial of access and shall contain, in sufficient detail and particularity, the grounds upon which the requester believes release of the information is required. The NSA/CSS Appeal Authority will endeavor to respond to the appeal within 20 working days after receipt, absent any unusual circumstances.



(U) The attached letter responds to FOIA request of 28 November 2006, for 2-5 official documents associating NSA and the Rosman, NC site that would confirm NSA was the actual owner/tenant of the site and that SIGINT was performed at that location $(\hat{b})(3) - \hat{P} \cdot \hat{L}$. 86-36 2 exterior photographs of the facility.

(U//FOUO) Searched CTS/WACO using in both the first and last name position and found no other requests from this requester. However, I located several previous cases on this subject. All previous requests were very broad and, therefore, administratively closed due to high search fee estimates. I emailed a search cost estimate to in DC36 on 2 February 2007. John responded on 16 February 2007, indicating a search would be required to determine if any responsive records existed in his office. The estimate was for 2 hours of search which totaled \$88.00. Because the estimate is within the amount of time the requester is eligible to receive at no cost, I asked John to perform the search on 22 February 2007. John responded on 9 March 2007, indicating that Rosman records have been scanned into ADMS, are located in box #16983, and are available for online retrieval. Due to the large volume of documents available in ADMS, I discussed this case with Marianne, and she advised me to conduct some quick searches in ADMS and on the intranet for some simple articles on Rosman. I located the following and had them scanned into my case:

- <u>A History Today article</u> dated 14 April 2005, marked U//FOUO, however each paragraph marking is UNCLASSIFIED. We were going to release this article with the initial response letter because all paragraphs are Unclassified. However, Pamela informed us that there is new guidance being drafted now concerning the release of NSA employee names. So she advised us to wait.
- <u>NSA Communicator, Vol. 3, No. 17</u> dated 24 April 1995, Doc Ref ID #A3110317 marked CONFIDENTIAL
- 4. <u>The Rosman Story</u>, Doc Ref ID #A451576. It is unmarked and was prepared by BENDIX. This doc appears to be a resource from NASA's days at the Rosman site that was left behind for the new tenants. It

describes the facilities and surrounding area. We thought that this document could be used for the two exterior pictures requested.

This case will be placed on the Easy Queue since all of the documents require a review. Pamela and I checked the Declassification Guide Number: 404-01 and determined that the fact of SIGINT activity previously being performed at Rosman is unclassified.

(U) We advise requester of his "all other" fee category and explain that there are no assessable fees for this request since the total number of pages falls within his 100 free pages and the search took less than 2 hours. We inform requester that we have completed our search, located responsive records, and placed his request on the backlog queue for Non-Personal Easy cases, to be handled on a "first-in, first-out" basis. (U//FOUO) The attached letter responds to FOIA request of 28 November 2006 which requests "between 2-5 official documents associating the NSA and the Rosman, NC site. Something official that would confirm that the agency was the actual owner/tenant of the site and that SIGINT was performed at that location...2 photographs of the site..."

(U//FOTO) This is the only request to date from His name is protected by FOUO because he is an NSA employee. Per the declassification guide number 404-01, the fact of SIGINT activity at Rosman is unclassified. Four documents, 28 pages, were scanned in to respond to this request.

--A451576 is a 21-page Bendix publication from March 1977, "The Rosman Story." It is a guide to the area around the station and appears to be directed at employees new to the area. It is pre-NSA at Rosman, when NASA ran the site, and contains no NSA equities. It was included in this case to accommodate the request for photographs. Ergo, two photographs are provided; the rest of the document is "non-responsive." The two photos are the one on the cover (p. 1) and on page 2. Operating on the theory that anyone could have taken the photos, we do not refer the document to NASA, since nothing else is being released.

--A3110317 is a four-page NSA Communicator from 24 April 1995. The responsive section is an article on pages 3-4, "Rosman Closes Its Doors." The only redactions were the dollar value of equipment and material on page 3 and the value of savings to NSA on page 4 taken under (b)(3) 86-36.

\(b) (3)-P.L. 86-36

--A3122648 is a 2-page Cryptologic Almanac article from 14 August 1996, "Rosman Tracks on to the End." The 3rd paragraph should be classified: the association of coverterms with specific mission, the identification of specific antennas at a specified site, and the fact of a SIGINT mission at a still-active site. The 4th paragraph should not be classified. The fact of a SIGINT mission at Rosman has been declassified, so the mention of "intelligence production" (meaning, for NSA, SIGINT) does not require protection./

Redactions were taken in the 3^{rd} and 5^{th} paragraphs under (b)(1) (b)(3)/ALL to protect the details of the mission

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and its successes. Even though long past, release of this information would give insight and assistance to our adversaries. The names and SIDs of NSA employees were protected under (b)(3) 86-36.

--A3122651 is a 1-page "History Today" blurb from the NSA Daily page of 14 April 2005. The only redactions were the names of two NSA employees who had been Chiefs of Station at the site. Under the new guidance concerning the release of NSA employee names, the names of Field Chiefs at open sites are no longer automatically releasable.

(U//FOUO) We inform that we are releasing some (b)(3)-P.L. 86-36 information to him and that some information is redacted by (b)(1), and (b)(3)/ALL. We provide him with appeal rights for the information that is withheld.



This responds to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request of 28 November 2006 for "2-5 official documents associating the NSA and the Rosman, NC site. Something official that would confirm that the agency was the actual owner/tenant of the site and that SIGINT was performed at that location. The other part that I would like is 2 photographs of the site." A copy of your request is enclosed. Your request has been processed under the FOIA and the documents you requested are enclosed. Certain information, however, has been deleted from the enclosures.

Some of the information deleted from the documents was found to be currently and properly classified in accordance with Executive Order 12958, as amended. This information meets the criteria for classification as set forth in Subparagraphs c and g of Section 1.4 and remains classified TOP SECRET and SECRET as provided in Section 1.2 of the Executive Order. The information is classified because its disclosure could reasonably be expected to cause exceptionally grave damage to the national security. Because the information is currently and properly classified, it is exempt from disclosure pursuant to the first exemption of the FOIA (5 U.S.C. Section 552(b)(1)).

This Agency is authorized by statute to protect certain information concerning its activities, as well as the names of its employees. Such information is exempt from disclosure pursuant to the third exemption of the FOIA which provides for the withholding of information specifically protected from disclosure by statute. The specific statute applicable in this case is Section 6, Public Law 86-36 (50 U.S. Code 402 <u>note</u>). We have determined that such information exists in these records, and we have excised it accordingly.

Since these deletions may be construed as a partial denial of your request, you are hereby advised of this Agency's appeal procedures. Any person denied access to information may file an appeal to the NSA/CSS Freedom of Information Act Appeal Authority. The appeal must be postmarked no later than 60 calendar days from the date of the initial denial letter. The

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appeal shall be in writing addressed to the NSA/CSS FOIA Appeal Authority (DJ4), National Security Agency, 9800 Savage Road STE 6248, Fort George G. Meade, MD 20755-6248. The appeal shall reference the initial denial of access and shall contain, in sufficient detail and particularity, the grounds upon which the requester believes release of the information is required. The NSA/CSS Appeal Authority will endeavor to respond to the appeal within 20 working days after receipt, absent any unusual circumstances.

Rosman Closes Its Doors

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(FOUO) When we reported on the decision to close Rosman Research Station (RRS) in Vol. II, #2, no determination had been made regarding the disposition of the Station and the physical plant. That was back in January 1994, so we thought it was time to provide an update.

(FOUO) Working together with the folks at Rosman, a team representing all of the Key Components assisted with establishing the closure process. It planned for the worst case scenario where the Agency might be required to demolish the infrastructure and restore the property to a pristine forest by the end of FY97. Before the site's last mission was shut down in November 1994, word of the closure was revealed by the local press motivating various state and local groups to begin making requests. For example, one group investigated the possible use of the site, intact with all of the equipment, to use as an uplink to the information super-highway; another saw possibilities for turning it into a tech school for computer/communications skills; and Transylvania County asked for the fire truck.

(FOUO) This closure was the first involving an "NSA-owned" facility, but fortunately such processes are governed by DoD property disposition regulations. Most of the operational and administrative equipment was excessed to other SIGINT facilities. The local school systems received some of the old personal computers and the fire truck did end up at a local fire house. Much of the other equipment and related material has been recycled to other DoD and U. S. Government organizations. As of 10 April 1995, the estimated value of the disposed equipment and material was as follows:

- Returned/transferred to NSA/Ft. Meade
- Transferred to NSA field sites
- Donated via OUTREACH
- ***** Transferred to other organizations
- Shipped to NSA for disposal
- Transferred to Defense Logistics Agency/ General Services Administration depots

(FOLIO) RRS has made a very significant effort to recycle waste paper. So far over 7,500 pounds of shredded paper have been donated to Transylvania County for recycling as opposed to clogging the local landfill.

(FOUQ) As for the site, the buildings and infrastructure will be abandoned by the Agency and given to the U.S. Forest Service on 30 September 1995. This will occur as a result of the efforts of the local U.S. Army Corps of Engineers who worked with the RRS Chief of Station to negotiate a termination agreement with the U.S. Forest Service's District Ranger for the Pisgah National Forest. The agreement will save the Agency an estimated in demolition and reforestation costs. As part of the agreement, for a one-year period beginning in FY96 NSA will assume caretaker responsibility for the site. Unless another tenant is found in the meantime, one government employee and a few contractor personnel will remain during the caretaker period to provide physical security and facilities maintenance support.



Just that it was good while it lasted. Those who worked at the Rosman Research Station (RRS) in Transylvania County, North Carolina, agreed that this was true. The site recently closed its doors after thirty-two years of operation. (SL/ST) (FOUO) The remote Rosman Research Station, the size of a small industrial park and having four huge satellite dishes, was built on 202 acres of national forest land about 140 miles west of Charlotte The National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) built the station in 1963 to track satellites. NASA originally chose the Rosman site because the mountains provided a "quiet zone" free of interference from unwanted radio signals. They planned two different operations: the first was a Multi-Mission Operation, established to record and/or transmit data to the Goddard Space Flight Center in Greenbelt, Maryland, from some thirty-six different orbiting spacecraft. The second operation was the Applications Technology Satellite, basically a collection of data for various technologies having wide applications in space and space flight, including manned space flight. NASA pulled out of Rosman in 1981, and in April of that year the mission started with the Department of Defense's (DoD) official 1 July takeover. (POUQ) Contractors from Bendix, Raytheon and Allied Signal, Inc., along with National Security Agency civilians/ TSL After the DoD takeover, the work at Rosman, even the number of employees, was a closely guarded secret. Budget cuts and the removal of the station's primary function forced the Agency to cease operations on <u>31 March 1995.</u> (TSC). In spite of adversity, significant notoriety came to the RRS

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(FOUG) It had not been an easy task to find tenants for the RRS facility. The Forest Service did not want it and the cost of upkeep would be a part of the takeover. They knew they would have to give i away since under federal law they could not sell it. So the trick wa finding someone who would have an interest in the exchange. The Fore Service was eventually able to strike a deal with Texas Joint Ventures/Rosman Research Partners. When NSA was notified by Art Rowe District Ranger, United States Department of Agriculture, that the station had acquired a new owner and was making a trade of \$10-\$15 million in buildings and land, it was a sad time for many who had wo at the station. Nevertheless, it was a windfall for the U.S. Forest Service. And, according to the former and last NSA Chief of Station, new owners plan to "renovate the site for two-way communications and claim to have several "blue-chip" companies interested in using the facility. He goes on to say "any deal of a new owner would be a good dealfor NSA since complete turnover prior to the end of our Care and Custody commitment on 30 September 1996 will result in significant savings for our agency."	that t s st rked the

NASA had operated its facility in the midst of this "quiet zone" since 1963 to track and receive data from unmanned satellites.
